Reflection Questions

1. What were your expectations when you first started to work on the paper and on the product and with mentor? Did your experiences meet those expectations? How did they differ?

When I first began working on this project, I was scared that the research essay would stress me out for the entire year (as previous seniors have mentioned). I was also scared that I'd become bored of the topic, or wouldn't be able to find a mentor. Alhamdulillah, although the project was stressful at times, Sr. Naseera, Ms. Ayesha Mall, and my parents helped me out tremendously. They all guided me and gave me helpful feedback, making the ride much smoother than it would have been. And I fell in love with the topic, alhamdulillah.

2. What problems did you encounter while researching and writing your paper? What was your greatest resource in overcoming these obstacles?

To be honest, finding a drive to actually write was probably my biggest obstacle. Sometimes, finding the time to work on the project was difficult, as was finding reputable sources and weeding out unnecessary information. My paper's organization was very messy at first, but thankfully, my mother, Sr. Naseera, Sr. Ayesha Mall's help was instrumental in my survival.

3. What was the most interesting or surprising information you learned in your research?

4. What did you learn about yourself during this project? How will you use what you

learned throughout the rest of your life, academic or not?

wouldn't normally want to, can open new doors for you. At first, I wasn't too enthusiastic about

writing an 8-page essay about the benefits of honey. I mean, it was interesting, but not enough

for me to write a lengthy essay about it. In the end, I learned so much, and somehow became
